This year two projects were awarded with the second place as they got the exact same score. The winners are:

- 1<sup>st</sup> Place: Lorach et al., Walking naturally after spinal cord injury using a brainspine interface
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Place: Willett et al., A high-performance intracortical speech BCI;
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Place: Losanno et al., An implantable brain-body interface using intrafascicular stimulation to restore hand functions
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Place: Metzger et al., Highly generalizable spelling using a silent-speech BCI in a person with severe anarthria
